DIRECT TO TENANT RENTAL SUBSIDY (DTT)

If you are a senior 65 and over, renting and earning less than \$47,000 a year, you may be eligible for the Direct to Tenant Rental subsidy (DTT). The Resource Centre has been very successful in helping seniors apply for this subsidy. Please feel free to reach out to us to see if you are eligible or for any assistance in applying for this benefit.
